About GDC

GDC is a private higher education institution that specialises in design education. Its mission is to be leaders in design higher education, to nurture innovative and responsible designers for the greater good of humanity. The institution was established in 1987 and over the years has graduated over 1200 designers. It currently offers three-year undergraduate and one-year postgraduate degrees in Interior Design, Graphic Design and Multimedia Design. GDC is a relatively small institution and runs from a single campus based in the trendy suburb of Greenside, Johannesburg.

About FADA

FADA is the Faculty of Art, Design and Architecture of the University of Johannesburg and is committed to fostering creative and professional excellence in art and design education. This dynamic and exciting Faculty has a colourful 80-year history during which it has been associated with numerous highly successful individuals in the world of art, design and architecture. Heritage has been defined as "that which we inherit: the sum total of wild life and scenic parks, sites of scientific or historical importance, national monuments, historic buildings, works of art, literature and music, oral traditions and museum collections together with their documentation"

Visas to South Africa

South Africa exempts citizens from many countries from requiring a visa to enter the country. The Department of Home Affairs website (www.home-affairs.gov.za) has comprehensive details on visa requirements and exemptions and the relevant forms for downloading. If you are one of the few travellers subject to visa requirements, you should apply for your visa at least a month before you intend to travel, and wait for it to be issued before you travel. No visas are issued at South African points of entry. If you arrive without the necessary paperwork, immigration officials are obliged to refuse you entry.

Travel and Accommodation

Delegates will need to arrange and finance their own travel and accommodation. We have partnered with an independent travel agency, SureTravel, who will be able to assist delegates in finding and booking accommodation near the venues in neighbouring suburbs such as Rosebank. Buses will be provided for transport between the venues (FADA and GDC).
